To prepare months before
☐ Have a valid passport for the length of the stay in China.
Receive the invitation letter from your host.
Check if you need a visa in the <u>list of visa exempt country</u> . Documents and procedures
required for the application are:
Filled the Chinese visa application form online and print it.
 Have a passport-sized photo in color and with a white background.
 Have the invitation letter printed. Ensure with your host it is adequate for visa application.
(Sometimes) Proof of legal residence.
 Submit your application to the visa application center of the city you choose during the online procedure.
Have your plane tickets sorted.
Have your hotel or accommodation sorted.
Subscribe to a health insurance covering your stay in China.
To prepare days before Some Western internet services you may use are blocked. You should either: Subscribe to an international data plan with your current mobile phone operator. OR buy a data plan from an eSIM service providers, if compatible with your phone. OR reach out for advice from the scholars working in mainland China who invited you
Install <u>Alipay</u> through the Google Play store or the iOS appstore, set it up, and link a bank card to it.
Install Amap through the Google Play store or the iOS appstore and change the
language to English.

Passport (with visa if applicable). Plane tickets printed. Including reservation of return ticket. Invitation letter printed. Reservations of accommodation printed. Have this information accessible easily offline: Address of stay. Name of the institute, university, company, or person who invited you and their address. Have a pen. (Optional) Any other documents that might serve as proof that you have an on-going working contract as an academic or a researcher outside of China, that you are covered by a travel insurance, that you have enough money to sustain yourself, etc. Once landed at the airport in China Get some cash. (Optional) Get a Chinese phone number.

To have on you the day of your trip
